

Wakatipu Park and Ride Services

The Way to Go group made up of Queenstown Lakes District Council, Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and the Otago Regional Council are exploring options for future Park and Ride services in key locations around the Wakatipu basin. This will play an important role in improving the wider transport network and providing local and visiting drivers with safer and more convenient options for getting around the basin.

It's early in the process but we've landed on a short list of possible locations for future Wakatipu Park and Ride services. We'd now like to test these options with the community to help guide our next steps. Feedback is open and will be received through an online survey up to 21 September 2020.
